## **Eastern Shore History: Seaview**

There has been an air of mystery with the beautiful Lot 36 at what is now Seaview POA. All that remains is the brick foundation of what was once a classic and substantial home as shown below.



According to Whitelaw, land was transferred to family members and others frequently in the early years of the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> century. In 1762 James and Sarah Henry re-acquired the 487 ½ acres of land from John Thompson. Probably soon after 1762, they built the large brick house which existed until the mid 1800's. In its day, the house was probably one of the finer homes, complete with handsome paneling, deep-set windows, ogeemolded bricks and doors and windows topped with a nice dentil pattern. The foundation of the kitchen annex contained a brick marked MC 1803 which was never found by the owners of this property from 2003 to 2019. In the 1845 deed, the property was called SEA VIEW which has never been changed.





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
